



# Welcome

Welcome to the fourth annual Berkeley Springs Film Festival!

For a small festival, we have an exceptional selection of independent films. Nine of our selected films were made within 100 miles of Berkeley Springs and one was shot at the Cacapon Resort in Berkeley Springs where we are holding the festival this year! The total list includes many narrative (scripted) films, feel-good films, documentaries, and a few horror films. Most are low budget films but some have significant investments. Many of the films will be debuting at our festival!

42 films were submitted to the festival and the judges selected the best 26 to be screened providing over 15 hours of entertainment. The films are not rated and some contain foul language, but none contain nudity. Also, we told filmmakers not to submit films having to do with COVID or political themes.

The festival does not have a "theme". The judges select films based on good entertainment and production value, not the message, so we have films of various genres ranging from feel good dramas, documentary, sci-fi to horror. In addition to providing a great program for viewers, we wanted to make our festival very supportive of filmmakers. While some have mastered the technical aspects of the art form and are making a living wage, most are struggling. Film festivals mean a lot to independent filmmakers. They provide a venue for filmmakers to see their hard work (many of whom spend hundreds or thousands of hours on a project) shown to an audience for the first time. Our festival also supports filmmakers by providing a free festival pass, free seminars, lots of awards they can use for promotion, prizes, and an opportunity to network with other filmmakers to collaborate on future projects.

We are especially proud to have Stanley Livingston, who played Chip on the long running TV series My Three Sons, fly in from LA to share his 60 years of acting, writing, directing, and producing experience with our attendees. We also are excited to have Stunt Coordinator Johnny Becker and his crew share his knowledge about how to stay safe on set, and provide an exciting bar fight and shootout demonstration. We especially want to thank the West Virginia Film office (see rear cover) for sponsoring our seminar speakers! For more information on our seminars, see the details on page 7.

Film festivals also provide a rare opportunity for filmmakers to get direct audience feedback in order to learn and grow in craft and art. There will be a brief Q&A after each film block where filmmakers can answer questions. Please also take some time to meet the filmmakers, compliment them on their accomplishments, and share your thoughts on their film. Also please show your support and encouragement by staying for the Awards Ceremony from 6:00 to 6:30 PM Saturday evening. We promise it will be entertaining. Then stay for the After Party (see page 14) downstairs in the Panhande Room. Order a cocktail, dinner or just socialize and network with filmmakers, cast and crew. If you are interested in film, introduce yourself to a filmmaker whose work you like, and offer to volunteer on their next project. They are always looking for people to share their passion and effort.

Following the After Party, from 8 to 10 PM we scheduled the Premier screening of the horror film *Wind and Bone* shot right there on the premises of the Cacapon Resort last year! This is the first time this feature film will be available to the public and many of the cast and crew will be attending.


# **Saturday Seminars**

#### **Set Safety and Stunt Demonstration**

9:00 AM to 10:00 AM Saturday in the Morgan Room



We are honored to have Stunt Coordinator Johnny Becker provide a seminar. His credits are too long to list here, but include Live Free or Die Hard, Wonder Woman 1984 and House of Cards.

His one-hour presentation will include a 15 minute stunt show, with the players explaining safe techniques of fighting, falling, stunt driving, camera angles, forced perspective and firearm

safety. Also, the use of breakaway glass and plastic, balsa boards, safely falling into cardboard boxes, squibs, blood packs and different types of pads and mats. A Q&A session would follow. This is not to make you into a qualified stunt man, but to give you a general understanding of professional stunts so you will recognize a safe and unsafe practices on your film set. Safety first!




An Al Story – To Be or Not to Be (19 min)







In a small town in Virginia a young family forwards the tradition of Sorghum pressing and makes sweet autumn memories.




Bonding (14 min)

For Middle School and High School Teachers: The West Virginia Film Office has teamed up with Film Pittsburgh's Teen Screen program, which thanks to a Benedum Foundation grant, offers free screenings of regionally-made films to help teachers tap into film as an additional source of education. Teen Screen and its team of educators selects films that best support school curricula and build programs around them, including teaching materials, additional resources, and guest speakers. Within the fall semester alone, they shared films with schools across Ohio, Kanawha, Wetzel, Marion, and Monroe Counties in WV. They've worked with hundreds of students, enhancing their learning experiences in various subjects while helping them and their teachers meet West Virginia academic standards. Their films include features, documentaries, and shorts that highlight topics such as Civil Rights, Environmentalism, The Holocaust, Innovations in STEM, Cultural Relativism, The Power of the Arts, Women's Empowerment, World Languages, and various Literary Themes.
